

Visiting Felicity House – Advice & Guidance

The Prophetic Traditions are numerous with regards to the etiquette a guest should uphold and the manner in which one's neighbours are to be engaged. As such, it is of the utmost importance that the guidelines below, which have been conveyed from our teachers, are adhered to when visiting Felicity House. The full co-operation of Felicity House's visitors is needed, in relation to these guidelines, to ensure the success of the building as a positive influence in the local vicinity.

Parking

Parking points have been clearly stated in the accompanying map. Visitors should refrain from parking on Northdale Road or any of the neighbouring streets. Visitors are encouraged to car-share where possible.

Journeys should be carefully planned so that visitors head towards the streets and locations that have been designated as parking locations as opposed to travelling directly to Felicity House. Traffic through Northdale Road should be kept to an absolute minimum.

Sisters should be given preference to park on North Drive.

Pick-up

Visitors are kindly requested to walk to their cars and avoid picking people up from outside Felicity House or anywhere on Northdale Road unless it is an absolute necessity.

Entering and Exiting the Building

At no point should visitors gather outside the building; whether before or after a programme, daytime or evening. The noise level should be kept to an absolute minimum. Visitors should be punctual for events, classes and the like. In addition, visitors should be swift in exiting the building at the end of a programme, particularly those that fall in the evening.

Children

Children should stay with parents/guardians at all times. They should not be left on their own at any point (including the main hall & mezzanine). This rule applies whether visitors are attending classes, gatherings or events.
